- Book Published: In collaboration with Department of English, Girls Empowerment Cell, organized Online program of Book-Publication event on 13th July 2021. In Presence of Dr. Savita Kelkar and Principal Dr. Seema Purohit. Delegates made announcement of 'book is published'. Purohit madam introduced the book and Kelkar madam appreciated the work done by team. The theme of book is the elite and successful women who are the pillars of socio-economic status of India. Editor of the book is Dr. Suneeta H. Nirmale, co-editors are Miss. Ankita Shinde, Simran Parmar, Kshitija Patil, Moli Bansal, Lavanya Pati.
- 2. Counselling: Girl's empowerment cell and mentoring cell organized Online Interactive Session on 'Need for and importance of Counselling' the program organized on 11th February 2022; guest speaker was Ms. Shruti Tekawade the counselor in BMCC. First, Principal Dr. Seema Purohit madam addressed the audience. And then, Ms. Shruti Tekawade. she is a trained professional counsellor and therapist with specialization in clinical psychology. Guest speaker stated the meaning of word 'counsellor'. Also, she said, how a counsellor can help students with different psychological issues and how students must approach counsellors immediately if it requires. She gave her insightful and comforting talk about various problems that the youth is facing, especially in their transitioning age. The other issues were discussed as adjustment, having difficulties in coping with their emotions, facing some interpersonal and relationship, health, peerpressure, and concern about their academics etc. She further stipulated that youngsters may not find it easy to take decisions on their own due to lack of self- confidence. The following quote fulfills meaning of the program, 'The strong individual is the one who asks for help when he needs it.' said Rona Barrett.
- **3.** Workshop: on "Self-Defense Training", Chief Guest of the program was Mr Sachin Baikar, who is retired special force commando, member of Funakoshi Shotokan Karate Organization, successful Instructor of Self-Defense, Weapon Training, Biometrics, the Judge and Referee of Karate. He honored this program along with his team, on Thursday, 3rd March 2022, in B. M. College of Commerce. In today's world women need to protect themselves. Women are facing more challenges, doing night and outdoor duties, travel alone. She must be ready to save herself and the life of others who would be caught in danger.

Principal Dr Seema purohit madam interacted on how self-defense is important. NCC coordinator prof Asama Bagwan also shared her thoughts on the topic, "Stree Jnmachi Badalaleli Kahani" She revealed change in responsibilities of the women in modern time in multitasking.

Mr Sachin baikar sir spoke on why self-defense is necessary for every girl, every woman? He emphasized the point Why should we learn defense measures? Which will help at the time of assault, robbery, and seductive attacks. He said that we have many weapons that will protect ourselves i.e. our hands, teeth, kada, nail-cutter, even a single pen and a simple piece of paper in our hand can protect ourself. He taught and demonstrated some self-defense techniques like lock and block to the enemy. Demonstrations of weapon training were shown by the team of students with black belt Karate. They showed practices of Single Stick, Double Stick, Spear (Bhala), Sword (Talwar) and Dandpatta, Nanchak. Inspired by all, Sneha Choudhari one of the students (F. Y. B. Com, BMCC) spontaneously demonstrated single stick swing. The team had also shared videos of Commando Training, Jungle Safari which have been taking place under his guidance. Co- Ordinator GEC & NCC Girls former Dr. Suneeta H. Nirmale, & later Dr. Asma Bagwan were guided the girls. Sheetal Vanage, one of the staff members of BBA office took initiative for organizing the program.

4. International Women's Day: Woman power is the mother of all powers. A woman can do everything. And someone must be proud about. With a view, to encourage the girls, to steer them to the progress, Girls Empowerment Cell and Entrepreneurship Development Cell jointly celebrated 'International Women's Day'. All professors encouraged the girls. Boys in BMCC supported and helped to design and performed this program.






